TEACHING TO THINK ABOUT THE FUTURE AND WORK IN COMPULSORY EDUCATION Padova, April 11 (9.30 to 18.00)

The latest models of vocational psychology propose early activities to be implemented in the compulsory school, providing the massive involvement of family contexts, school and community. This seminar presents the characteristics of career education and some good practices already widely tested in compulsory education.

The seminar addresses to career professionals who are interested in scheduling early career educational interventions (in terms of prevention), in developing skills associated with the representation of the future, the theme of work and life designing.

Tools and examples of activities aimed at deepening the representation of the world of work will be presented. These analysis and examples should facilitate curiosity, exploration, and a more constructive way to think about the future.

The seminar explores the themes of job placement and career development in the light of the Life Design approach recently proposed by the group led by Mark Savickas, Northeast Ohio Medical University.

In particular, during the seminar qualitative and quantitative tools for the analysis and evaluation of career preparedness, time perspective, and adaptability will be presented. These components provide support for career choices and life design of people with or without impairments.
